EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

The Residential Hospice of Grey Bruce is changing the way end-of-life care is being delivered in our region. In a year and a half of operation we have provided compassionate, dignified and expert care to over 115 patients and supported their families when they chose our Hospice to help them in the final stages of their life. We were there when they needed us and each of them touched us in their own way. Each of them made us better. We cared for them with the knowledge, skill and compassion that our community expects and deserves because we are your community Hospice.

Being recognized as a community Hospice is important to us. We are proudly run by a volunteer Board reflective of the people that make Grey and Bruce counties such a wonderful place to live. We have a Team of local Registered Nurses, Personal Support Workers, and volunteers who are supported by spiritual counselors, palliative care physicians and social workers all functioning together to provide comfort and support to those in our care. These are the people who put on offer their expertise and time to ensure we are creating a hospice that recognizes that those in our care are our neighbours, friends, or family and deserve no less than our best. And it's working.

We know we are a community Hospice because we are serving patient and family needs from across both counties. We are a truly regional operation, providing care to a greater number of patients from outside the city of Owen Sound than from within. In fact over the past year we have seen a consistent increase in the

number of people from across the both counties choosing us for their end-of-life needs. For the past 11 months our occupancy levels have most often exceeded 80% and we are seeing loved ones come to us from places like Port Elgin, Kincardine, Hanover, Dundalk, Walkerton, Williamsford and

Allenford.

We know we are a community Hospice because we have become an important part of the local health system, supporting our local hospitals, physicians and other care providers by offering patients and families another option at end-of-life that just a few short years ago

did not exist. This year over two-thirds of our patients have come to the Hospice from a local hospital, allowing us to provide our expert service in a home-like setting for those in their final days.

What really makes us a community Hospice though, is our connection to you. We are a dedicated, professional and local Team who have just one focus and that is collaborative patient and family-centred care at time when it is needed the most. For as much as those who have experienced our compassion and expert care have thanked us, we are grateful and humbled when residents from Grey and Bruce come to us when we are needed.

A COMMUNITY OF FRIENDS

In partnership with the South West Local Health Integration Network and the South West Community Care Access Centre, the Residential Hospice receives government funding for Nursing staff and Personal Support Workers only. The budget for the other daily operations and management of the hospice are funded exclusively through community donations.

With the support of our community, we are able to offer patients and families exceptional care in a comfortable and home-life environment. We use donations to equip our patient rooms with amenities that contribute to patient and family comfort or purchase individual items to improve their experience. Donations also cover the cost of leasing our temporary space at Seasons.

Because we rely so strongly on the community, we commit ourselves to being accountable to you. Our website and

Facebook pages are continuously updated to share with you information on how the Residential Hospice is being accessed, where our patients are coming from or our monthly occupancy levels. As well we share some details on how we're using donations to improve patient and family care. Our Strategic Plan is posted online so you can know what our priorities are going to be in the months ahead. Our Audited Financial Statements are also publicly available so that you can have the confidence that your donation is making a difference in patient care at the Hospice.

We are incredibly grateful to everyone throughout Grey and Bruce counties who purchased tickets, supported a hiker, donated prizes, made an "In Memoriam" donation, invited us to speak to your service club or volunteered your time and talent to make all of fundraising initiatives successful. It takes a community to build a hospice.



VOLUNTEERS A GIFT TO OUR HOSPICE

We could not do what we do without the tremendous contribution of volunteers from our community and the difference they make in our care for patients and families every day. The Residential Hospice of Grey Bruce offers two kinds of volunteer opportunities.

Supportive care volunteers work in the residential hospice, providing a variety of services. They perform tasks like greet people at the door, provide respite for families, chat with patients, deliver food and do light housekeeping. Supportive care volunteers take part in palliative care education classes to help give them more comfort in their role at the Hospice and strengthen their contribution to patient and family services.

Administrative volunteers work at the hospice business office in downtown Owen Sound. They collect donations, answer the phone, give out general information about the hospice, and provide administrative support.
