BOARD CHAIR'S APPEAL FOR BUILDING FUND

By the time you factor in the cost of necessary equipment purchases and the generosity of 'in kind' donations of materials from a number of businesses operated by local families like the McArthurs, Shouldices, Sutherlands and Vandolders; Chapman House was close to a \$5 Million undertaking. In addition to ongoing fundraising for operational needs, the Board of Directors had established an extremely ambitious goal, aiming to have everything built and paid for by the time they opened the doors to Chapman House. Although that target was not achieved entirely in advance, we're over 90% of the way there in roughly 2 years! That said, and recognizing there will be ongoing capital needs as we expand services to more residents of Grey-Bruce, I'd like to implore businesses and individuals to raise the remaining funds and to avoid incurring borrowing costs.

The amount pegged for the Building Fund is \$500,000, so if you're able to assist us in covering this we'd greatly appreciate your donations before the end of 2017. Chapman House is truly a remarkable place that was built FOR our community BY our community. Please help us to become debt-free.

NICOL INSURANCE OFFERS BACKUP TO CHAPMAN HOUSE

And that's literally speaking! A few months ago in the final phases of the building project, our Board was faced with a difficult decision as to which components were necessary up front as opposed to desirable to have in place.

When CEO Bob Nicol learned that having a backup generator was at risk of being deferred, his company and Intact Insurance stepped forward and found a way to jointly cover the total installation costs of \$50k up front.


Chapman House is free to all residents and their families because we believe that a person's financial condition should not determine whether they have access to specialized end-of-life care...and we intend to keep it that way!

Our residential hospice is staffed with nurses and personal support workers 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and our average daily cost per bed of close to \$500 is less than half the cost of a hospital bed in Ontario. We provide an invaluable service to our community, as efficiently as we can.


Unfortunately, although the Province of Ontario fully supports the palliative care we provide, funding is only provided for nursing and personal support worker staffing. This means all other aspects of our operation such as patient meals, medical equipment and the comfort of our rooms are only possible through donation.

Each year we rely heavily on our community to help cover these costs and make ends meet. It's simply the reality of a health care system that's stretched to its financial limits, regardless of which political party is in power.
