MANAGER OF RESIDENT & FAMILY CARE

The word "Hospice" comes from the Latin "Hospitium" meaning guesthouse. Hospice palliative care is aimed at relieving suffering and improving quality of life for individuals who are living with or dying from advanced illness. The philosophy of hospice is to provide support for the residents' emotional, social and spiritual needs as well as management of symptoms. It focuses on enhancing comfort, dignity and choice. While the residents' needs are paramount, care at Chapman House also includes supporting caregivers, family and friends. Caregivers often come into their role suddenly and often unexpectedly, and as such, a family caregiver may not have the insight necessary to provide the care that their loved one needs. Hospice staff also help family caregivers understand what to expect as their loved ones illness progresses and how to adjust and adapt in accordance with their changing needs.

Our Residential Hospice is staffed with nurses and personal support workers 24 hours a compassionate comfort care in day, 7 days a week. We also rely on our resident and family care volunteers who are also trained to support both the resident and families. The hands-on nature of hospice staff work branches far beyond simply providing physical care for our residents. Their calm and attentive presence, expert execution of care, and unwavering spirit of compassion creates a bond between resident and staff that invites both comfort and peace throughout endof-life. During the final weeks, days and hours, hospice staff and volunteers provide a loving, reassuring presence while providing comforting care that ensures that the resident is as free from pain and discomfort as possible. We know if you spoke to our hospice staff, they would not find their work depressing but rather would look at their work as rewarding and honoured having been given the opportunity of compassionately caring for the dying resident's and their families during such an intimate time.


Occupancy Rate


Average Length of Stay

EXPANDING IMPACT

The Residential Hospice of Grey Bruce is currently working on expanding its impact in the communities of Bruce & Grey. The creation of a second residential hospice location will allow us to provide palliative comfort care to an estimated 70-90 additional residents per year. This expansion will also enable residential hospice care to be available within a 45 minute drive of most Bruce & Grey residents.

We are grateful to the Municipality of Brockton who in the fall of 2019 gifted us a piece of land located in Walkerton to build a second 6 bed facility. A volunteer committee of Southern Bruce & Grey residents has been established and are in the early stages of fundraising.


